## "Cool Breeze" is anything but for our Co-editor

Your regular Co-editor, Sheryl Keeme, was seriously injured during the "Cool Breeze California Century" charity ride on August 21 when she and a friend were crashed out by the trailer of a big rig. According to an article in the Ventura County Star, the right rear section of the trailer hit Sheryl knocking her into a riding partner and both were thrown to the pavement and into a guard rail. Sheryl sustained a broken leg/ankle and lacerations on her back. Her riding companion broke her right hand and wrist and suffered a head injury as well. We wish both of them a speedy and complete recovery!

As of the date of the article no citations had been issued, but CHP was still investigating the crash.

As of August 26, Sheryl was back in Arizona "residing" at Mercy Gilbert Hospital where she was having surgery, and was able to contact Sterling Baer and your "substitute editor for September" by e-mail.

# The Best New Place to Ride in AZ: Sedona's Red Rock Road

On Saturday, August 21, **Mike Litecky** and I joined **Dennis Dempsey** and **Gene Holmerud** of the **Coalition of Arizona Bicyclists** and a number of officers and members of the **Verde Valley Cyclists Coalition** in a celebratory ride marking the completion of the Highway 179 project that created bicycle lanes from outside the Village of Oak Creek north to the main intersection (Hwy 179 and Hwy 89A) in Sedona. It's hard to imagine a more significant 7-mile stretch of road anywhere in the USA with respect to bicyclists.

Why do I say that?

Here's why:

- A basically unbikeable road (blind corners, no shoulder, no bike lanes, and high vehicle volume) has been transformed into a true multi-modal transportation corridor.
- The transformation benefits bicycle commuters, "roadies" and mountain bikers looking for access to nearby trails.
- The new infrastructure facilitates bicycle access to what has been deemed (USA Today poll) the most beautiful area in the USA.
- The project is the first "Context Sensitive Solution" project ever undertaken by ADOT, which altered the course of transportation planning in Arizona. Previously, ADOT had planned a four-lane, limited access highway from I-17 into Sedona. The local "uproar" and involvement of groups such as the Verde Valley Cyclists Coalition caused ADOT to reconsider, slow down, seek community involvement and, in the end, achieve a truly well-designed roadway that better fits the needs of residents and visitors to the area.

## Did You Know?

- **Maricopa County transportation funding in jeopardy** – As reported in the *Arizona Republic* on Sunday, August 29, transportation funding (up to \$1.7 Billion) may be jeopardized by inability to adequately maintain clean air in Maricopa County. Other than the obvious health reasons, why should bicyclists care? Because this funding source is the mechanism for matching funds and project funds for many bike/pedestrian projects. Millions of dollars of federal funding each year go to bike lanes, road widening, bike/pedestrian bridges and other infrastructure for bicyclists. Maricopa County is in seriously hot water right now, today, and needs to take action to cut particulates in our air. Your health and your cycling infrastructure are at stake.

- **How to become a Bicycle Friendly Community?** – Do you live in a community that is not yet designated as "BFC"? - **There are efforts underway to establish a USBRS** – What would you think about having a United States Bicycle Route System spanning the country in a fashion similar to the interstate highway network? Efforts to achieve that type of system are underway, and are actually being headed by an Arizona bicyclist. Richard Moueur is a long-time cyclist and Arizona highway official, and currently chairs the Task Force on U.S Bicycle Routes for the American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO). In 2003, groups such as the Adventure Cycling Association, East Coast Greenway and the Mississippi Trail approached the Federal Highway Administration to push this idea, and things finally got moving. To date, Adventure Cycling has mapped over 40,000 miles of cross-country routes, many of which may be used in the USBRS (states have to individually and collectively decide what routes they want to support).
- **Pro Road Bike Races in both Arizona and Colorado by 2012?** – Announcements have come out that there will be high level pro road bike races in both Arizona and Colorado by at least 2012. The Arizona race would be slotted as a lead in to the Tour of California, while the Colorado race (with Lance Armstrong involved) would be in a slot leading up to the Tour de France. This all brings back memories of the Red Zinger/Coors Classic days (Grewal, LeMond, Hampsten, Phinney, Hinault, "the Russians", etc...and wouldn't that be great. Think of grass-roots American cycling of the 70's and 80's meets the modern sponsorship and Versus TV coverage world. I'm not sure exactly how all that chaos would turn out, but you can bet your bottom bracket I'll try to attend both events to be a part of cycling history.
